



This comprehensive report is in accordance with the Trade Organizations Act, 2013, and Trade Organizations Rule, 23 (2), outlines the Annual Performance Review of the three-year plan of activities for the Construction Association of Pakistan (CAP). This plan was duly approved by the Executive Committee in its 137th Meeting held on January 27, 2024, and is presented for onward submission to the Director General, Trade Organizations (DGTO), Government of Pakistan, Islamabad.

#### Executive Committee Initiatives (January 01, 2021- 31st December, 2023):

## 1. Establishment of CAP Help Desk:

After extensive meetings with Pakistan Engineering Council (PEC), CAP successfully established a dedicated help desk at PEC Headquarters, Islamabad. This initiative aims to promptly address day-to-day grievances of constructors and has proven to be effective in facilitating them.

#### 2. Importation Policy Advocacy:

CAP actively engaged with the Ministry of Commerce, Engineering Development Board, and Ministry of Industries to seek permission for the import of used specialized construction machinery, emphasizing a maximum age limit of 15 years. The case was discussed but still pending. However, efforts are on ways to get it approved.

## 3. Enhancing Financing Procedures:

Meetings with key Ministries - Planning and Development, Communication, and Finance - were held to streamline and improve financing procedures for construction projects. Further, CAP proposed to GOP that the projects without the availability of funds may not be approved by the relevant forum for floating the tenders in future.

#### 4. Bank Guarantees Replacement Advocacy:

CAP pursued the replacement of bank guarantees with AA-rated insurance guarantees. PEC issued corresponding instructions in support of this change.

## 5. Alternate Dispute Resolution (ADR) Implementation:

Recognizing the importance of Alternate Dispute Resolution (ADR), CAP actively pursued the resolution of disputes through this mechanism.

## 6. International Business Challenges:

Acknowledging the economic situation and terrorism challenges in the Middle East, CAP recognizes the impact on the international business scenario, causing a slowdown in the industry.

#### 7. Reducing Duties and Sales Tax:

CAP engaged in multiple meetings with relevant authorities, advocating for reduced duties and sales tax on both local and imported construction machinery and materials. Final Tax Regime was abolished and final Tax Regime was converted to minimum Tax.

#### 8. Construction Industry Development Board (CIDB) Creation Efforts:

Intensive efforts are underway to create the Construction Industry Development Board (CIDB), a pivotal step toward establishing a one-window facilitation center and an independent authority for the construction industry. CIDB will ensure ease of doing business for Consultants and Contractors (especially the small and medium enterprises) by eliminating, overlapping and redundant requirements. The benefits of CIDB are as under:-

- Promote the establishment of a Construction Bank which shall cater to the specialized requirements of the sector especially in facilitating project financing and provision of guarantees and bonds based on project cash flows.
- Formulate, prepare and implement Construction industry Development policy in consultation with all stakeholders on procurement with ensured transparency.
- Prepare and update cost indices and maintain a countrywide uniform schedule of composite and material rates.
- Co-ordinate with Federal and Provincial technical training institutes to establish industry linkages for determination of HR skill sets and skill level requirements.
- SMEs to become sustainable with new Construction and Consulting companies being formed.
- Change the industry from 3Ds to 3Ps (i.e. from "dirty, dangerous and demanding "to one which is "professional, productive and progressive :).

#### 9. Affiliation Seeking:

CAP remains active in seeking affiliations with relevant forums to enhance its industry influence.

#### 10. Office Establishment and Expansion:

CAP has successfully established offices in Islamabad and Lahore. Ongoing efforts involve setting up temporary offices in provincial headquarters for better member's facilitation, with a focus on acquiring free land for the construction of a permanent CAP office in Islamabad and Karachi.

#### PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHT FOR THE YEAR 2021:

#### 1. Election Conduct:

CAP conducted the 2021 election in compliance with trade laws and rules, ensuring a peaceful transition of power to elected representatives.

#### 2. Membership Maintenance and Growth:

CAP maintained its membership level and successfully enrolled 759 new members, a testament to its positive reputation within the construction community.

#### 3. Annual General Meeting Compliance:

The Annual General Meeting for the year ending September 30, 2021, was held in compliance with DGTO rules and the Memorandum of Articles of Association.

## 4. CPEC Project Success:

Through meetings and negotiations, CAP secured for its members a contract for the CPEC western corridor, marking a significant achievement.

## 5. Pre-Budget Proposals:

Proactive participation in the pre-budget process, with submissions for rebates on custom duties, sales tax, and income tax related to the construction sector.

## 6. Expo Participation-Capacity Building:

CAP members participated in the 5<sup>th</sup> Pakistan Industry Expo held on 29<sup>th</sup> to 31<sup>st</sup> October, 2021 at Royal Palm Club, Lahore for the capacity building for exploring the business opportunity.

CAP actively participated in international conferences and industry events, fostering connections and disseminating knowledge among its members.

## 8. Challenges and Mitigations:

CAP faced challenges such as economic slowdown, energy shortages, and fuel price hikes, impacting construction activities and membership renewals. Despite financial constraints, information dissemination was maintained through alternative channels.

## 9. Executive Committee Meetings:

Regular meetings were held, addressing construction industry issues and partially resolving challenges. Active participation in PEC elections further demonstrated CAP's commitment to industry governance. During the year 06 Executive Committee Meetings were held on the dates, 6th February, 29th May, 5th July, 7th September, 18th September and 27th October, 2021.

#### 10. International Market Awareness:

Engaging with the international market, CAP motivated its members to import quality construction machinery, particularly for roads, high-rise buildings, and industrial projects.

#### 11. Pakistan engineering Council Election 2021-2024.

CAP actively participated in the election of Pakistan Engineering Council for the term 2021-2024 and CAP supported candidate was elected as Chairman PEC.

## 1. Standard Bidding Documents Development:

CAP played a vital role in developing and following up on Standard Bidding Documents, contributing to industry standardization.

## 2. Establishment CIDB and Constructions Industry Fund/Bank:

Ongoing efforts toward CIDB creation align with CAP's commitment to administrative and statutory matters, including licensing, bidding procedures, and recovery processes. Constructions Industry Development Fund/Bank will facilitate constructors to participate in PPP projects both locally as well as internationally, Commercial Banks avoid taking any risk lending to the construction sector presently, despite a high ROI. Another major benefit is that to significant GDP Growth will be ensured through growth of construction industry locally as well as through participation in construction projects in other countries.
